City Prepares \$1M for Shoreline Property Owners The WATER Project Forms Flood Protection Committee

Since securing \$1M in State funding to assist shoreline property owners, The WATER Project has been coordinating a Flood Protection Committee. The FPC's goal is to protect our community from flooding while ensuring that water access will be unrestricted at all times. This will be achieved by facilitating adequate shoreline protection for properties along the canals. Shoreline infrastructure investments will not only deter flooding but also eliminate the FEMA floodplain designation for the entire Jefferson-Chalmers community.

CW Johnson Negotiates Multi-Million Investment with GLWA





On July 17, the City Planning Commission (Commission or CPC) approved through a recommendation for **Planned Development (PD)** rezoning to allow for the Great Lake Water Authority's (GLWA) \$138M Freud Street Pump Station, located at the corner of Freud and Conner in the Jefferson-Chalmers community.

While the Courts arbitrate whether a jurisdiction has created an ILLEGAL SPOT **ZONE**, some residents arue considering litigation that would challenge CPC's recommendation and delay or cancel the project.
